Profile of the College:

Bhawanipur Anchalik College is one of the nerve centres of Higher Education in the vast rural area of Bhawanipur, Assam. It was in the year 1982, this premier institute of Higher Education was initially started in the premises of Bhawanipur Primary Health Centre. The establishment of Bhawanipur Anchalik College was possible mainly due to the contributions and hard works of the people of Bhawanipur and its adjoining areas. The college was shifted to its present site in 1984. The institution is located on the western side of 27 (East-West Highway) No National Highway, 2 kilometers from Bhawanipur Chowk Bazar and four kilometers from Sarupeta Railway Station. Bhawanipur Anchalik College was affiliated to the University of Gauhati in 1991 and was brought under deficit grants-in-aid system of the State Government in 1996. The College is being managed by a Governing Body constituted under the management rules of the Department of Higher Education, Government of Assam, India. Bhawanipur Anchalik College has been included in 2f and 12(B), Registration Act of UGC in January, 2006. The serene atmosphere, calm green surrounding, water reservoir in the form of fishery, and abled administration are conducive to academic pursuits. To prepare students to meet the challenges of the modern world and inculcate the spirit of leadership of different avenues have all along been the guiding principles of the college. The college has been maintaining good record of performances in the Council and University Examinations.

In the year 2012, the Governing Body with thorough scrutiny of the demand of the locality planned to apply for the permission from the University of Gauhati to open Commerce Stream. As per the planning, application was submitted and the university, after official inspection, granted permission to open Commerce Stream by its official Memo No. GU/AFF/2012/2315-18, Dated 11-06-12. Thus, the college has made proper provision of Commerce education since 2013 for the students of the greater Bhawanipur Area in specific and Assam, India in general. Once again, the greater Bhawanipur area found itself lacking in science education options. Responding to this need, the college authorities initiated the process for the addition of another stream. After the persistent efforts of the Governing Body of the college, Bhawanipur Anchalik College received approval and post-sanctions to introduce the science stream through the Assam Government's orders AHE, 90/2022/11, dated 08-09-2022, and PC/HE/Misc.117/2018/167, dated 15/10/2022. Offering three streams, the college is now equipped to offer multidisciplinary courses along with the traditional stream-based programs, aligning with the objectives outlined in the National Education Policy, 2020.

Four Years Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

1. Guidelines of FYUGP (Under NEP 2020)

1.1 Introduction

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under Bhattadev University (BU) is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The policy recognizes that education plays a primary role in moulding and shaping the destiny of the nation. The policy endeavours to develop India in accordance with the values enshrined in our Constitution- a democratic, just, socially conscious, cultured and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity and justice for all. The new policy therefore attempts to synthesize and harmonize the knowledge of ancient India and the emerging knowledge of the different fields so that the education system produces world leaders in all fields of human endeavour. The system wants to do away with rote learning and encourage critical thinking, logical decision making and innovation. It wants to reestablish India once again as world or global teacher (vishwaguru) across all fields of knowledge as it once was in the ancient time. The FYUGP is designed to fulfill the diverse academic needs of the student and seeks to offer options of multiple entries/exits and obtain a Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with Major or a Degree (Honours) or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy.

1.2 Objectives

- (i) The primary object of this Regulation is to identify and foster the unique qualities of each learner and to promote a holistic development of the learner.
- (ii) It also attempts to provide the learners with the opportunity to choose their learning programmes and progress in life according to their interests or talents.

- (iii) The policy attempts to provide interdisciplinary and holistic education drawing from different subjects and disciplines for a new emerging world of interdependence between different disciplines.
- (iv) The policy emphasizes on conceptual understanding, critical thinking and innovations.
- (v) The policy upholds human ethics and constitutional values of our country and emphasizes on building life skills like the team work, leadership and communications.
- (vi) The policy emphasizes on the use of technology in teaching and learning and removes all kinds of language learning barriers.
- (vii) The policy endeavours to ensure respect for the heterogeneous culture of India and promote local language and knowledge through the various stages in the curriculum.
- (viii) The policy emphasizes on equity and inclusion in matters of all educational decisions so that all students can thrive in that environment.
- (ix) The underlying policy is to ensure that the education system is rooted in the values of Indian civilization and its rich, diverse, ancient and modern culture, language, knowledge system and traditions.

1.3 Curricular Goals

The curricular and credit framework of FYUGP under NEP 2020 seeks to ensure the following for the students:

- Flexibility to move from one discipline of study to another
- Opportunity for learners to choose the courses of their interest in all disciplines
- Facilitating multiple entry and exit options with UG certificate or UG diploma or degree depending upon the number of credits secured
- Flexibility for learners to move from one institution to another to enable them to have multi and/or interdisciplinary learning
- Flexibility to switch to alternative modes of learning (online, ODL, and Online learning, and hybrid modes of learning).

1.4 Eligibility for Admission into FYUGP

- A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution.
- Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference on the disciplines to be chosen as Major and Minor. At the end of 2nd Semester, student may request to alter the major and minor, subject to the availability of seats and marks obtained in the 1st year.
- Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a department and also on the criteria set by the concerned departments.
- No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless she/he fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.

1.5 Reservation

Statutory reservation policy of the Government of Assam shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.

2. Programme and Curricular of FYUGP (Under NEP 2020)

2.1 Overview and Structure

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semesters, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a minimum credit allocation of 20. All together the minimum credit requirements for a 3-year programme is 120 and for a 4-year programme, its 160. The minimum credit requirements for BU FYUGP are as follows:

Key Points: For Exit after 1st or 2nd year, students have to complete a mandatory vocational course of credit 4 during the summer vacation.

2.3 Curricular Components

The entire FYUGP curriculum is divided into two parts

- (A) Core Courses and
- (B) Common Courses

(A) Core Courses

The core courses constitute Majors and Minors. A student will choose one Major subject and a Minor subject. Different options are described in the next section. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. Altogether, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 21 courses with total credit allocation of 84 over a 3- year programme. In four year programme, minimum credit for major is 80 and minor is 32.

(a) Major Course

The minimum credit requirements for a Major Course over a 3-year period are 60 accumulated from 15 Courses and 80 credits for 4 years UG programme from 20 Courses.

(b) Minor Course

The minimum credit requirements for a Minor Course over a 3-year period for 24 accumulated from 6 papers and 32 credits for 4 years UG programme from 8 Courses.

(c) Double Major Course

Provided a student has a Major Course with 60 credits, s/he can convert his/her Minor Course to a Double Major only with a credit allocation of 48 for 3 years and 64 for 4 years.

(B) Common courses

As the name suggests, these courses will have to be studied by all students of FYUGP. Together the common courses have a credit allocation of 36 divided over five subdivisions. They are

- (a) Inter-disciplinary Courses (IDC): Total Credits 9
- (b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) : Total Credits 8
- (c) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) : Total Credits 9
- (d) Value Added Courses (VAC) : Total Credits 8
- (e) Internship : Total Credits 2

A brief description of these courses is given below

(a) Inter-disciplinary Courses (IDC)

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects —

- (i) Natural and Physics Science
- (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications
- (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences
- (iv) Commerce and Management and
- (v) Humanities and Social Sciences

The level of these courses is of Class XII. Each student need to take at any three courses, each with 3-credits from these five sub- groups during Semesters 1-3.

Key Points: A student **CANNOT** choose a multi-disciplinary subject, if he/she has already studied that subject during Class XI-XII. Also the subject of these courses **MUST** not be among the Core Subjects the student has already chosen

(b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

It includes Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication) and AEC is divided into four Courses each of credit 2 from semester I to IV.

(c) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three Skill Courses, each with 3 credits, in Semesters 1, 2, & 3.

(d) Value Added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups. All together they will have a credit allocation of 8.

- (i) Understanding India
- (ii) Environmental Science
- (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions and
- (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports and Fitness.

Each student will have to take any two courses, each of 4-credits, from any four groups during Semesters 1 & 2. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

(e) Internship

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 2. The internship can be carried out within semester 6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

2.4 Progression and Exits

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

(a) After 1 Year

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirements are 40 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational course).

(b) After 2 Years

One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirements are 80 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational course).

(c) After 3 Years

If a student completes 3 years and earned required credits, he/she can exit the programme. In this case the student will get a Bachelor's Degree with major or with double major.

(d) After 4 Years

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research with single or double major depending on the credit s/he has earned. Students will be eligible for Honours with Research, if she/he earns at least 75% marks or equivalent CGPA in the first six semesters. For Honours with Research student need to a 12 credit Course on Research Project/Dissertation.

Admission Procedure

Admission into HS (Arts and Science) under AHSEC

Students are advised to go through the AHSEC guidelines and ensure registration through DARPAN portal. Students are to submit application form through DARPAN Portal. The date for submission of Application Form, and Admission are to be notified in DARPAN Portal, the College Notice Board as well as in the College Website (www.bacollege.ac.in). Last date of application and taking admissions are strictly maintained in our college too as it is specified by AHSEC through the DARPAN portal.

There is reserve quota for candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC, Physically Handicapped and candidates having certificates of proficiency in 'extra-curricular' activity as per Policy of the Governments.

An applicant has to go through the following steps to apply online.

Step 1: An applicant has to visit DARPAN portal of AHSEC and to apply for admission giving necessary information. They have to select Bhawanipur Anchalik College in the college name. Our college will select students from the DARPAN portal as per capacity of the college in each stream. The merit list prepared through DARPAN will be displayed in the college website/portal and admission will be held as per date, venue and time to be declared by the college in notice board and in the College Website (www.bacollege.ac.in)

Step 2: The applicant should click "New Enrolment" and when new window will open up he/she will have to register by filling up required fields. The applicant should have a valid Email ID (preferably at Gmail) and a mobile number for registration. Login by using your mobile number as user ID and giving your own pass word. Only One mobile number can use by one applicant.

Step 3: After successful registration the applicant will have to fill up the admission form as per his/her requirement. Along with other details he/she should put bank accounts details like Bank name, branch, account numbers, IFSC.

Step 4: Then he/she has to upload his/her passport size photograph and scanned signature there.

Classes are taken through off line as well as Online modes. Incampus offline classes are arranged in the campus and Online Classes are conducted through ICT tools and devices. Offline classes are conducted with the help of the available facilities in the class rooms. From this session ICT classes have been made compulsory for the benefit of the students.

Minimum Attendance Requisites

A student must attend at least 75% of the total classes held in an academic session, otherwise he/she is declared Non-Collegiate (NC). A student who does not attend at least 50% of the classes held in an academic session is declared Dis-Collegiate (DC) and the students of the category may not be considered fit for filling up examination forms. Non- Collegiate **Students are fined Rupees 500/- (Five Hundred) each** with all other fees at the time of form fillup.
