COM-GE- RC- 5036 (A)	Principles of Micro Economics	The objective of the course is to acquaint the students with the concepts of microeconomics dealing with consumer behavior. The course also makes the student understand the supply side of the market through the production and cost behavior of firms.
COM- DSE- RC-6016 (A)	Advertising	The objective of this course is to familiarize the students with the basic concepts, tools and techniques of advertising used in marketing.
COM- DSE- RC-6016 (C)	Management Accounting	To impart the students, knowledge about the use of financial, cost and other data for the purpose of managerial planning, control and decision making.
COM- DSE- RC-6016 (D)	Computerised Accounting System	This course seeks to enhance the skills needed for computerized accounting system and to enable the students to develop simple accountingapplications
COM- DSE- RC-6026 (A)	International Business	The objective of the course is to familiarise the students with the concepts, importance and dynamics of international business and India's involvement with global business. The course also seeks to provide theoretical foundations of international business to the extent these are relevant to the global business operations and developments.
COM- DSE- RC-6026 (B)	Office Management and Secretarial Practice	The purpose of this course is to familiarize the students with the activities in a modern office. Smooth functioning of any organization depends upon the way various activities are organized, facilities provided to the staff working in the office, the working environment and the tools and equipments used in office.
COM- DSE- RC-6026 (C)	Fundamentals of Investment	To familiarize the students with different investment alternatives, introduce them to the framework of their analysis and valuation and highlight the role of investor protection.
COM- DSE- RC-6026 (D)	Consumer Affairs and Customer Care	This paper seeks to familiarise the students with of their rights as a consumer, the social framework of consumer rights and legal framework of protecting consumer rights. It also provides an understanding of the procedure of redress of consumer complaints, and the role of different agencies in establishing product and service standards.
